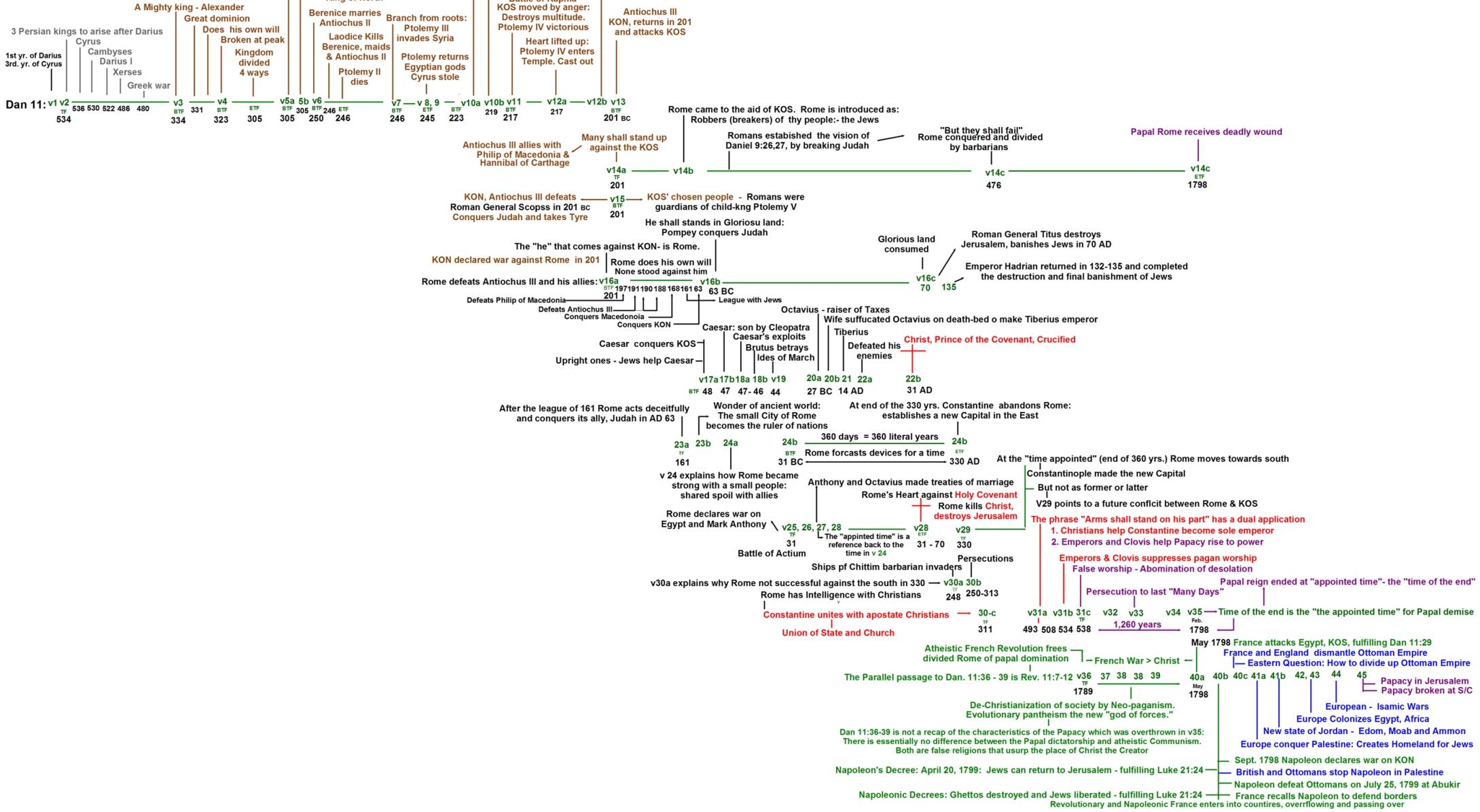


Outline of Daniel 11

3 Persian kings to arise after Darius
1st yr. of Darius
3rd. yr. of Cyrus
Cyrus
Cambyses
Darius I
Xerxes
Greek war

Dan 11: v1 v2
TF 534
536 530 522 486 480

A Mighty king - Alexander
Great dominion
Does his own will
Broken at peak
Kingdom divided 4 ways

King of South Ptolemy I of Egypt
A prince of the KOS stronger: Seleucus I becomes King of North
Berenice marries Antiochus II
Laodice kills Berenice, maids & Antiochus II
Ptolemy II dies

One of his sons: Seleucus III raises a large army
Antiochus III invades Egypt.
Battle of Raphia
KOS moved by anger: Destroys multitude. Ptolemy IV victorious
Heart lifted up: Ptolemy IV enters Temple. Cast out
Antiochus III KON, returns in 201 and attacks KOS

Rome came to the aid of KOS. Rome is introduced as: Robbers (breakers) of thy people:- the Jews
Romans established the vision of Daniel 9:26,27, by breaking Judah
"But they shall fail" Rome conquered and divided by barbarians
Papal Rome receives deadly wound

Antiochus III allies with Philip of Macedonia & Hannibal of Carthage
Many shall stand up against the KOS
KON, Antiochus III defeats Roman General Scopos in 201 bc
Conquers Judah and takes Tyre
KOS' chosen people - Romans were guardians of child-king Ptolemy V
He shall stand in Glorious land: Pompey conquers Judah

The "he" that comes against KON- is Rome.
KON declared war against Rome in 201
Rome does his own will None stood against him
Rome defeats Antiochus III and his allies: v16a
Defeats Philip of Macedonia
Conquers Macedonia
Conquers KON

Caesar conquers KOS
Upright ones - Jews help Caesar
Caesar: son by Cleopatra
Caesar's exploits
Brutus betrays Ides of March
Octavius - raiser of Taxes
Wife suffocated Octavius on death-bed o make Tiberius emperor
Tiberius
Defeated his enemies
Christ, Prince of the Covenant, Crucified

After the league of 161 Rome acts deceitfully and conquers its ally, Judah in AD 63
Wonder of ancient world: The small City of Rome becomes the ruler of nations
At end of the 330 yrs. Constantine abandons Rome: establishes a new Capital in the East

Rome forecasts devices for a time
Constantinople made the new Capital
But not as former or latter
V29 points to a future conflict between Rome & KOS
The phrase "Arms shall stand on his part" has a dual application
1. Christians help Constantine become sole emperor
2. Emperors and Clovis help Papacy rise to power

Rome declares war on Egypt and Mark Anthony
Battle of Actium
Ships pf Chittim barbarian invaders
Persecutions
Rome has intelligence with Christians
Constantine unites with apostate Christians
Union of State and Church

At the "time appointed" (end of 360 yrs.) Rome moves towards south
Rome's Heart against Holy Covenant
Rome kills Christ, destroys Jerusalem
Emperors & Clovis suppresses pagan worship
False worship - Abomination of desolation
Persecution to last "Many Days"
Papal reign ended at "appointed time"- the "time of the end"

Atheistic French Revolution frees divided Rome of papal domination
French War > Christ
The Parallel passage to Dan. 11:36 - 39 is Rev. 11:7-12
De-Christianization of society by Neo-paganism. Evolutionary pantheism the new "god of forces."

Dan 11:36-39 is not a recap of the characteristics of the Papacy which was overthrown in v35: There is essentially no difference between the Papal dictatorship and atheistic Communism. Both are false religions that usurp the place of Christ the Creator

Napoleon's Decree: April 20, 1799: Jews can return to Jerusalem - fulfilling Luke 21:24
Napoleonic Decrees: Ghettos destroyed and Jews liberated - fulfilling Luke 21:24
Revolutionary and Napoleonic France enters into countries, overflowing and passing over

May 1798 France attacks Egypt, KOS, fulfilling Dan 11:29
France and England dismantle Ottoman Empire
Eastern Question: How to divide up Ottoman Empire
Papacy in Jerusalem
Papacy broken at S/C
European - Islamic Wars
Europe Colonizes Egypt, Africa
New state of Jordan - Edom, Moab and Ammon
Europe conquer Palestine: Creates Homeland for Jews
Sept. 1798 Napoleon declares war on KON
British and Ottomans stop Napoleon in Palestine
Napoleon defeat Ottomans on July 25, 1799 at Abukir
France recalls Napoleon to defend borders
